## **Annual Hunt**

AMDA's 2008 Annual Hunt was held on August 16<sup>th</sup> at the Oak Flat Picnic Ground. There were 21 paid hunters and their families that enjoyed a great day in the mountains ending late in the day with rain, lightning and thunder. Everyone had a great time even if the weather was not on our side at the end of the day.

The planters had to plant in the fog. When the hunt started it was still a little cool and foggy but ended up being great weather for the hunt. One hour before the event was over is when the excitement started. **If you have ever been in the mountains when there is lightning and thunder, you know what we are talking about when we say it was REALLY, REALLY LOUD!** We were so thankful that we had the shelter to be under.

There were 1577 targets and coins planted in the field. There were 68 top prizes and 137 other prizes plus the 43 prizes remaining from Peter's hunt. **Our annual hunt had prizes with values of over \$3000.00.** Every paid hunter received two door prizes and a bag with magazines, dealers' catalog and flyers, and gifts from Garrett and White's. Everyone went home a winner from the 2008 Annual Hunt. A program was also given to all the members with lists of the prizes that had been donated by dealers and club members.

We had great success this year with dealers donating prizes and giving the Club discounts on items for the Annual Hunt. **A total of 80 prizes were received as donations.** The list of the dealers that donated is in the newsletter. 3. NEVER DESTROY priceless historical or archaeological treasures.
4. DO NOT build fires, camp or park in non-designated or restricted areas.
5. LEAVE all gates and other accesses to land as found.
6. NEVER LITTER. Always pack out what you take in, and remove all trash dug in your search.
7. DO NOT damage, deface, destroy, or vandalize any property (including ghost towns and deserted structures). Never tamper with any equipment at the site.
8. RESPECT AND UPHOLD all finders, search and salvage agreements.
9. ABIDE by all laws – national, state, county and local.
10. ALL METAL-DETECTORISTS AND TREASURE HUNTERS ARE JUDGED BY THE EXAMPLE YOU SET. Conduct yourself with courtesy and consideration for others.
